How to link the JDS Retail Websites to your website

Frame Basics

A website displays one page at a time... unless you use frames. Embedding a frame within your website HTML code is a simple method that allows you to display more than one web page at a time, although they appear to be on the same page. It's a smart way of getting interactive, visual content on your website without designing anything. Below is an example of an embedded code using our non-branded JDS Retail Site URLs.

<iframe src "url_here"></iframe>
<iframe src="http://www.premiersportawards.com"></iframe>

The frame HTML code will reside within one of your web pages. This process is common, giving you the option to link to our site while the end-consumer never leaves your website. A content management system is typically required to embed your HTML code. It's recommended that you use a Web Designer to implement this code.

Link Basics

A link is a small bit of HTML code that connects one web page to another. There are two main parts to a link tag: the text a user can click and the web address (URL) they go to when they click it.

The text between the <a> and tags is the link text and is generally displayed in blue and underlined by web browsers. The href="URL" portion of the code is the web address, where the URL can be set.

A list of the JDS Retail Site URLs is on the other side of this document. If you are using a web designer to build your site, the JDS Retail Site URLs are all they will need to set up your links. Otherwise, you'll need access to a content management system to edit your website to add a link.
